The Iranian Ministry of Culture and Islamic Guidance has responded with increased filtering and surveillance, yet the demand for unblocked content persists, revealing a generational divide between institutional control and youth-driven innovation. Russia’s invasion of Ukraine introduced another layer. As state-controlled media tightened its grip, Ukrainian schools turned to decentralized platforms to distribute unblocked games that taught logistics, crisis response, and
