The alligator has long occupied contested symbolic ground in Southern culture. Early settlers feared it as a menace; settlers and ranchers labeled it "vermin" to justify eradication. By the mid-20th century, it became a tourist attraction—an icon of exotic wilderness packaged for consumption. The alligator in Oliver's poem becomes a metaphor for this lag—a creature that has survived human disruption for millennia, now poised to witness whether society can align its actions with ecological truth.

Ecologists and conservation biologists cite the Everglades as a bellwether for climate change resilience. Its wetlands sequester carbon, filter pollutants, and buffer coastal communities from storm surges. But Oliver's poem transcends scientific discourse. The Seminole's traditional ecological knowledge, often sidelined in restoration planning, emphasizes adaptive management and spiritual connection—principles mirrored in Oliver's poem. Yet global conservation often remains top-down, technocratic, and extractive, failing to integrate grassroots stewardship.
