Each movement progresses through phases of disruption and reformation—mirroring the nonlinear journey of healing. The fourth movement, titled **Silent Bloom**, employs a deliberately slowed tempo and breath-like phrasing, evoking the fragile emergence of life after devastation. Here, Stevens collaborated with sound engineer Lila Chen to develop a custom spatialization system, ensuring that the trumpet's timbre filled a 360-

degree audio field, creating an immersive, almost ritualistic listening experience. This spatial dimension reflects a broader evolution in performance practice. Unlike traditional concert settings, **Echoes** is often performed in site-responsive environments—abandoned factories, urban parks, or digital virtual spaces—where architecture and acoustics become collaborators. Such adaptations challenge the sanctity of the concert hall, redefining performance as an embodied, context-dependent event. For Stevens, this was essential: “Music must live where people live,” she stated in a 2022 interview with **The Wire** magazine. “If it remains in ivory towers, it becomes irrelevant to the struggles it seeks to articulate.” The long-term implications of **Echoes** extend beyond music into cultural memory and artistic methodology. It exemplifies a new paradigm: artists as curators of collective experience, using sound as a tool for empathy and historical reckoning.
