psychiatric study, documented how media depictions of violence—especially those involving children—could reactivate deep-seated fears, not merely in individuals but in societies attempting collective healing. The “Bambi Trigger” was not about the deer itself, but the symbolic resonance: a narrative rupture that reawakens latent trauma embedded in collective memory. This concept gained traction across Europe not just in clinical circles but in literature, philosophy, and early media theory, where it began to signify the power of stories to rupture emotional equilibrium when they mirror societal wounds.

From Clinical Psychology to Cultural Catalyst: The Evolution of the Concept

By the 1970s, the Bambi Trigger had migrated from psychiatric journals into broader cultural discourse, particularly in France and Germany, where trauma studies were flourishing.
