Others debated the ethics of portraying German officers not as caricatures, but as complex figures—motivated by ideology, fear, or personal ambiguity. Nemirovsky, though not a political theorist, had crafted a narrative that refused easy moral binaries, forcing readers into uncomfortable proximity with the gray zones of collaboration and resistance.
