By the 1980s, a new generation of Tanzanian scientists, conservationists, and policymakers—many trained in Western institutions but grounded in local realities—began advocating for a museum that would reframe the Serengeti's story from within. By 2015, it had become a key node in the East African Heritage Corridor, linking wildlife safaris with cultural immersion and scientific tourism. This integration has proven critical: the museum's presence has catalyzed investment in rural infrastructure, created over 800 direct jobs, and trained hundreds of local youth as guides, curators, and researchers—shifting economic flows from extractive industries to knowledge-based stewardship. Yet this transformation has not been without friction. Controversies have emerged around repatriation, access, and intellectual ownership. Several artifacts originally collected during colonial expeditions—including ceremonial masks and skeletal remains—are still held in foreign institutions, with ongoing debates about restitution. Under her direction, the museum launched the Serengeti Long-Term Monitoring Initiative (SLTMI) in 2010—a continent-scale data network tracking predator populations, vegetation shifts, and climate resilience across 12 protected areas.
