The African Union's African Charter on the Rights and Welfare of the Child includes a voluntary peer assessment mechanism inspired by the CRC model. Similarly, ASEAN's Child Rights Framework incorporates CRC-aligned evaluations, though implementation remains uneven. In Latin America, countries like Ecuador and Bolivia have integrated CRC scenario training into public administration, reflecting stronger regional commitments to participatory governance. This corporate adoption reflects a broader trend: the internalization of child rights as a core governance principle, not just a legal obligation. Yet, the test's reach remains uneven. In sectors dominated by informal labor—such as domestic work or agriculture—the practical application of CRC standards faces deep structural barriers. Here, the test's value is

most evident: it forces governments and businesses to confront the dissonance between policy intent and lived reality, exposing blind spots that audits alone cannot reveal. Expert Consensus and Critical Debates Among leading scholars and practitioners, the CRC Practice Test is widely acknowledged as a vital diagnostic tool, but not without significant critique.
