The government, heavily dependent on tourism revenue (which constitutes over 12% of GDP), has embraced high-profile conservation projects—funded in part by Gulf states, Western foundations, and international financial institutions—positioning Petra as a beacon of stability and cultural sophistication. Yet, Edwards reveals how this branding often bypasses local agency. The Petra Development and Tourism Strategic Plan, co-designed with international consultants, allocated only 3% of tourism revenue directly to community development, while Bedouin families were frequently displaced from ancestral lands under the guise of "buffer zones." This dynamic mirrors patterns across the region. In Iraq, UNESCO-backed restoration of Nineveh's ruins has been criticized for favoring foreign architectural firms and limiting Iraqi staff to low-tier roles. Similarly, in Syria, post-conflict heritage reconstruction, led by international coalitions, often replicates pre-war narratives curated by state authorities, sidelining minority and opposition voices. Edwards documents how foreign aid for heritage, while well-intentioned, frequently reinforces existing power asymmetries—channeling benefits to elites, corporations, and international experts rather than grassroots communities. Economically, the heritage industry has expanded exponentially. Global market research estimates the cultural tourism sector at over \$1.3 trillion, with archaeological sites driving 40% of visitor spending in key regions. Yet, this growth is uneven. In Jordan, private developers have built luxury resorts adjacent to Petra, leveraging proximity to the site while extracting profits with minimal reinvestment in local infrastructure. Edwards highlights a paradox: while tourism revenue flows into national

coffers, communities often remain economically excluded, dependent on low-wage service roles with limited upward mobility. Technology further complicates the equation. Digital reconstruction platforms—powered by AI, photogrammetry, and virtual reality—enable immersive experiences but raise questions of ownership. When a Syrian village’s ruins are digitized by a Berlin-based tech firm, who controls the model? Who profits? Edwards cites a pilot project in Palmyra where Syrian digital archivists co-developed an open-access 3D archive, allowing communities to curate their own narratives. This model, though nascent, signals a shift toward data sovereignty—critical to ensuring that digital heritage serves local memory, not external spectacle. Moreover, the rise of “dark tourism”—visiting sites of conflict, loss, or ancient tragedy—has intensified ethical concerns. Edwards notes that sites like Palmyra, reduced to rubble photographs and virtual tours, risk becoming commodified spectacles, where suffering is aestheticized rather than contextualized. This trend, she argues, reflects a broader societal habit: to consume history as entertainment, divorcing it from lived realities. Finally, Edwards contextualizes these dynamics within global inequality. While Western institutions boast state-of-the-art conservation labs and global outreach, many host nations lack funding, trained personnel, and legal frameworks to protect their own heritage. UNESCO’s World Heritage Fund, though vital, disburses only a fraction of its annual budget—leaving most nations to manage fragile sites alone. In countries like Yemen or Libya, where conflict has devastated archaeological heritage, international intervention often prioritizes visibility over sustainability, reinforcing cycles of dependency. Thus, “beyond the sandstone” is not merely a geographic or archaeological concept—it is an economic and geopolitical lens. It exposes how heritage is embedded in systems of power, capital, and representation, demanding a reimagining of stewardship that centers equity, transparency, and community sovereignty.
