He envisions a future where information systems operate with near-instantaneous awareness, dynamically adjusting to environmental and social inputs. But he remains grounded in caution: such systems demand unprecedented transparency, ethical foresight, and global cooperation. In a recent interview with *The Digital Quarterly*_, he stated, “The next decade won’t be defined by faster systems, but by wiser ones—systems that serve humanity, not the other way around.” His legacy lies not only in publications or frameworks but in a paradigm shift: MIS is no

longer a support function, but the nervous system of global civilization. O'Brien's work compels us to see data not as raw material, but as a living, relational force—one that shapes power, defines trust, and demands stewardship.
