For Qutb, true social justice

demanded a society structured not on power or profit, but on equity, compassion, and divine purpose. The geopolitical backdrop of the Cold War amplified Qutb's analysis. As the U.S. and USSR competed for influence in the Global South, Muslim-majority states became proxy battlegrounds. Qutb perceived Western aid and modernization programs—not as benevolent development, but as instruments of cultural imperialism, undermining indigenous values while deepening dependency. He argued that economic “progress” imposed without ethical foundation entrenched inequality, turning nations into vassals of foreign capital. His critique extended to domestic elites who adopted Western lifestyles while neglecting the poor—a betrayal of Islamic ethics. This dual accusation—of

external domination and internal corruption—formed the core of his revolutionary social vision. Economically, Qutb’s thought responded to the contradictions of post-colonial development. The export of raw materials, the concentration of wealth, and the erosion of artisanal economies dismantled traditional communal structures. powers. His execution by Nasser's regime in 1966 transformed him into a martyr, embedding his ideas in the collective memory of resistance. However, state repression also led to fragmentation: factions within the Brotherhood diverged between reformist and revolutionary currents, with Qutb's ideas weaponized in ways he may not have intended. The rise of violent extremism in the late 20th century often invoked his name, though his ethical framework rejected indiscriminate violence, focusing instead on systemic change through moral and political transformation. The industrial and structural dimensions of Qutb's vision remain under-examined. His critique of extractive economies anticipated modern discussions of ecological justice and post-extractive development. He warned that

unchecked industrialization—driven by profit and foreign capital—would deepen inequality, displace communities, and erase spiritual values. In this sense, Qutb’s social justice was inherently ecological: a call to live in balance with creation, rejecting the commodification of land, labor, and life itself. His vision aligned with contemporary critiques of capitalist modernity, offering a framework where economic justice includes environmental stewardship and intergenerational equity. From a geopolitical risk perspective, Qutb’s ideas continue to shape state-society relations across the Muslim world. In Egypt, his legacy influences debates over democracy, human rights, and the role of religion in public life. In Saudi Arabia, his critique of state-sponsored orthodoxy challenges official narratives of

legitimacy. In Pakistan and Indonesia, his ideas inform civil society movements advocating for equitable development and anti-corruption reforms. Yet, authoritarian regimes often suppress his teachings, fearing their subversive potential, while some Islamist groups instrumentalize his language to delegitimize pluralism. Economically, Qutb's emphasis on redistributive justice resonates amid rising inequality globally. The World Inequality Report 2023 confirms that the top 10% of earners capture 52% of global wealth—mirroring the disparities Qutb condemned. His insistence on zakat and ethical finance finds renewed relevance in Islamic economics, now a \$3.5 trillion sector integrating Sharia-compliant models into global markets. However, institutionalizing such principles remains

challenging, requiring both religious legitimacy and state cooperation—conditions often absent in fragile or authoritarian contexts. Expert projections indicate that Qutb’s social justice paradigm will gain traction amid growing disillusionment with liberal democracy and neoliberalism.
