and Houghton Mifflin Harcourt captured growing shares of state procurement. This shift reflected a broader neoliberal turn in public education: outsourcing curriculum design, standardization, and assessment to corporate entities. Florida’s choice of Go Math thus participated in a global trend where governments increasingly relied on commercial vendors to deliver educational content—raising questions about accountability, transparency, and democratic control over public learning. By 2016, Go Math Grade 4 had undergone three major revisions, each reflecting evolving policy demands. This choice underscored a broader tension in American education: between local autonomy and national standardization, between public stewardship and corporate influence.

Industry Impact: From Content Provider to Curriculum Architect

McGraw Hill's positioning of Go Math Florida Grade 4 exemplifies the transformation of educational publishing into a strategic industry. By 2016, the company had consolidated its role as a dominant curriculum vendor, supplying over 40% of K-12 math materials in states like Florida. The Grade 4 edition was not merely distributed—it was embedded in teacher training, aligned with digital platforms (e.g., McGraw Hill Connect), and supported by ongoing professional development. This integration turned the textbook into a node in a broader ecosystem of data collection, student analytics, and adaptive
