Wayneboro itself was established as a township in 1762 under the jurisdiction of Bedford County, named posthumously in honor of General Anthony Wayne—a figure central to the American Revolutionary War's western campaigns. Though Wayne never visited the site, the naming reflected a deliberate act of territorial legitimization, aligning local identity with imperial military prestige.

The town's early economy was defined by its location along emerging transportation corridors. The Great Indian Trail, later incorporated into the Great Wagon Road, funneled westward traffic through Wayneboro, transforming it into a minor but vital node in the colonial migration network. By the late 18th century, the convergence of riverine transport and overland trails catalyzed rudimentary industry: gristmills, sawmills, and blacksmithing clusters began to anchor the settlement. These industries were not revolutionary in scale, but they established a precedent for Wayneboro's role as a regional service center—an identity that would persist through centuries of change.

By the early 19th century, the advent of steam-powered industry and the expansion of the Pennsylvania Canal system redefined Wayneboro's economic geography. The Susquehanna River, once a natural highway, became a conduit for industrial transport, linking Wayneboro to broader markets in Baltimore and Philadelphia. The Civil War era deepened Wayneboro's integration into national economic and political currents. Though not a battlefield, the town contributed to wartime production through local manufacturing and labor mobilization. Post-war, the expansion of the railroad network and the advent of telegraph lines solidified its role as a regional logistics hub. Industrial diversification accelerated: by the 1880s, the township hosted multiple foundries, a burgeoning furniture industry, and a cooperative grain elevator system—all supported by a growing working-class population. Labor relations, however, were fraught. The 1892 coal miners' strike in nearby Schuylkill County rippled through Wayneboro, fueling union organizing efforts that met with both civic engagement and corporate resistance. These tensions foreshadowed 20th-century struggles over labor rights, corporate influence, and community identity.
