The Schlieffen Plan, Germany's offensive strategy, assumed a rapid invasion of France via Belgium, bypassing the heavily fortified Franco-German border. But Belgium's resistance, coupled with French and British counterattacks, bogged the German army in a costly stalemate. The Battle of the Marne in September 1914 halted the German advance, forcing a retreat that initiated trench warfare. By 1915, both sides had

adapted—constructing elaborate underground systems, deploying poison gas, and refining artillery coordination—but at an unimaginable human cost. The Somme and Verdun epitomized this horror. The 1916 Somme Offensive, intended to break German lines, resulted in nearly a million casualties for minimal gains—over 57,000 British deaths on the first day alone. Verdun, fought over six months, became a symbol of endurance and destruction: German forces battered the French stronghold with over 1 million shells, killing or wounding over 700,000 men. Casualties were so extreme that entire battalions were lost, and soldiers suffered psychological trauma now termed ‘shell shock’—a condition poorly understood and often dismissed by commanders. Technological innovation accelerated the war’s brutality. Submarines—U-boats—sank merchant ships and even hospitals, violating maritime norms. Aircraft evolved from reconnaissance tools to fighters and bombers, introducing aerial warfare’s lethal potential. Chemical weapons, first used by Germany at Ypres in 1915, introduced indiscriminate terror: mustard gas caused agonizing blisters, blinding soldiers and leaving lifelong scars. Medical advances, such as blood transfusions and mobile field hospitals, saved lives but could not stem the tide of death. The war’s military evolution reshaped global conflict. Total war demanded unprecedented state mobilization: conscription, propaganda, and industrial conversion. American exports supplied the Allies with critical supplies—machine guns, aircraft, chemical weapons—while \$32 billion in loans and later direct bank loans to Britain and France stabilized the Allied war effort. The Federal Reserve’s expansion of credit fueled domestic industrial output, though at the cost of rising inflation and debt. The war economy accelerated the decline of laissez-faire capitalism, proving that national survival required strategic state intervention. Post-war, these precedents endured. The 1919 Versailles Treaty imposed reparations on Germany, crippling its economy and fueling resentment.
