This redefinition influenced later realist and naturalist writers—from Zola to Dreiser—who saw disability not as tragedy but as a site of critical insight. Literary historian Ann Goldberg argues that Hugo turned fiction into a “public tribunal,” forcing France to confront its failure to protect the vulnerable—a precursor to modern human rights discourse. Economists studying 19th-century publishing note that **Notre-Dame**'s success pressured the industry to invest in longer, more ambitious works, knowing that narrative depth could command loyalty and revenue. From the 1923 silent film to Disney's 1996 animated reimagining, each iteration recalibrated the hunchback's symbolism: sometimes as a romantic outsider, other times as a revolutionary figure. In Japan, the novel was embraced during the post-war reconstruction era as a parable of resilience; in Latin America, its critique of institutional corruption resonated amid political upheaval. The figure transcended its Catholic context, becoming a universal metaphor for the outcast's

struggle for dignity. Looking forward, the novel's long-term implications are profound. In an era of rising populism, climate-induced displacement, and digital alienation, Quasimodo's cry—"Look upon me, and see the face of God in the broken"—resonates anew. The hunchback, once a literary anomaly, now stands as a prophetic archetype: the body that exposes societal fractures, demanding not charity but justice.
