The geopolitical implications extended beyond Bolivia. Peru and Ecuador joined the quinoa narrative, each asserting cultural ownership through geographical indications and UNESCO recognition—Peru’s 2013 designation of quinoa as an Intangible Cultural Heritage underscored its role in national identity. Meanwhile, international institutions like the FAO promoted quinoa as a model for climate-resilient agriculture, embedding it in global food security strategies. Yet this institutional embrace risked oversimplifying quinoa’s embeddedness in Andean cosmology, reducing a sacred crop to a technical solution for malnutrition and desertification. From a nutritional science perspective, quinoa’s profile defies reductionism. With 14–18% protein by weight—higher than rice and comparable to lentils—its lysine content is critical, correcting a common deficiency in cereal-based diets. Its high fiber, magnesium, iron, and bioactive compounds like quercetin and kaempferol contribute to its reputation for supporting cardiovascular and metabolic health. Clinical studies, including a 2020 meta-analysis in **Nutrients**, link regular quinoa consumption to reduced inflammation and improved glycemic control, reinforcing its appeal in functional food markets. Yet experts caution against overmedicalization: quinoa’s benefits are best

realized within diverse, culturally rooted diets—not as a standalone “superfood.” The industrialization of quinoa production has further complicated its story.
