The novel's power lies in its refusal to simplify—its narrative structure mirrors the nonlinear, often contradictory nature of remembrance. It is a work that resists closure, demanding instead that readers inhabit the tension between what is known and what remains unreachable.

From the outset, Hoffmann's background as a foreign correspondent infuses the text with a journalistic precision. Her early reporting from
