The institutional architecture of democracy, designed for a 19th-century electorate, faltered under the pressures of globalization, technological transformation, and demographic diversification. The geopolitical context further compounded these domestic challenges. The post-9/11 era saw a militarized foreign policy that prioritized security over civic discourse, while the digital revolution—epitomized by the rise of social media—reshaped how information was produced, consumed, and weaponized. The 2000s witnessed the dawn of “post-truth” politics, where emotional appeal increasingly overshadowed factual accuracy, a trend that would accelerate in the following decade. Against this backdrop, Paterson and his team at ICivics sought not to reform schools in isolation, but to re-imagine civic education as a dynamic, interactive process—one that could counteract misinformation, build critical thinking, and foster a sense of agency among young people.
