The emergence of digital health technologies, including electronic health records (EHRs), telemedicine platforms, and early wearable biosensors, began to disrupt traditional models, yet formal education lagged. Simmers, a veteran in health science pedagogy and a professor at a leading U.S. university, observed this dissonance firsthand. Students entered clinical training ill-equipped to navigate digital workflows, while administrators struggled to align training with evolving industry demands. The decision to develop a dedicated workbook arose from a convergence of factors: rising student enrollment in health professions, increasing employer demands for tech-literate graduates, and a growing body of evidence linking technology fluency to improved patient outcomes. The 2015 pilot, distributed to a cohort of pre-health students and early-career clinicians, revealed critical gaps—particularly in interoperability literacy, data privacy frameworks, and the ethical use of artificial intelligence in care delivery. It examines the WHO's Digital Health Strategy, the U.S. Office of the National Coordinator for Health IT, and the African Union's eHealth Initiative, highlighting how policy frameworks shape technology adoption.
