In West Africa, particularly among the Yoruba and Ewe, **Elegba Nere** ceremonies—honoring the spirit of the sea crossroads—regulate fishing seasons and marine conservation. These rituals impose informal “taboos” (e.g., prohibitions on fishing during spawning periods or near sacred reefs), functioning as community-enforced ecological safeguards. However, increasing industrialization and foreign trawling have eroded these practices: overfishing and habitat destruction undermine the very marine ecosystems rituals depend on, creating a feedback loop where spiritual authority
