The global market for above-ground pool components—including hoses, skimmers, and inline filters—has grown from a niche segment in the 1970s to a \$7.5 billion industry by 2023, with Asia-Pacific now accounting for over 40% of production, driven by rapid urbanization and rising household disposable income. In China, for instance, the proliferation of DIY home improvement culture and state-backed suburban development policies turned the above-ground hose into a ubiquitous fixture, embedded in both urban and rural housing stock. Conversely, in regions with weaker oversight, cheaper, lower-grade hoses flood the market, often leading to higher failure rates and associated public health risks—particularly in areas prone to extreme weather or high chemical exposure.

Geopolitical and Environmental Implications
