The "economic context" is pivotal: deindustrialization hollowed out traditional working-class bases, enabling authoritarian leaders to position themselves as defenders of national economy against globalist elites. In this framework, economic sovereignty is framed as national strength, requiring centralized control over trade, labor, and technology.

in closed-door forums with congressional hawks, advocating for expanded military budgets and harsher immigration enforcement—policies aligning with authoritarian statecraft. The revolving door between industry and government agencies fosters a culture where profit motives and political ideology blur, normalizing surveillance technologies, data harvesting, and militarized border policies. Digital platforms compound this dynamic. Social media giants, designed to maximize engagement, amplify divisive content—fueling polarization that authoritarian leaders exploit. Algorithms prioritize outrage, enabling coordinated disinformation campaigns that destabilize democracies from within. The 2016 U.S. election interference, Russian-backed but resonant across liberal democracies, revealed how private tech infrastructure can become a vector for authoritarian influence—undermining elections, eroding public trust, and normalizing foreign meddling. In Germany, Siemens and Thyssenkrupp have faced scrutiny for exporting surveillance technology and industrial control systems to regimes with poor human rights records. These corporate decisions, driven by profit, reflect a broader trend: global supply chains enable authoritarian modernization, where technological advancement serves state repression rather than liberation.

Geopolitical Realignment and the Fragmentation of Liberal International Order

The European Union, once a beacon of democratic integration, now grapples with internal fractures: Poland and Hungary reject rule-of-law conditionality, while Germany confronts rising AfD support. The transatlantic alliance, strained by divergent threat perceptions and economic competition, struggles to present a unified front. Geopolitically, the Third Reich's hallmark—state sovereignty weaponized against external norms—manifests in border fortification, digital autarky, and the rejection of international oversight. The Schengen Area's integrity is tested by Hungary and Poland's refusal to accept migrant quotas; democratic backsliding in Turkey under Erdoğan exemplifies how constitutional safeguards erode when concentrated power meets nationalist majorities.
