This article examines the biblical portrayal of Jezebel with deep analytical rigor, contextualizing her origins in 9th-century BCE Phoenician monarchy, tracing her transformation within the Hebrew Bible, and assessing her enduring influence on theology, gender discourse, and narrative construction—while interrogating the risks of mythologizing a contested figure.

Origins in Phoenician Royalty: Jezebel, Daughter of Ethbaal

Jezebel's origins lie not in biblical cosmology but in the dynastic politics of Tyre, the preeminent Phoenician city-state of the early Iron Age. She was the daughter of Ethbaal, king of Tyre, whose reign (circa 9th century BCE) placed her at the center of a powerful maritime empire. Kawami argue that the Jezebel narrative reflects post-exilic theology, where past failures are reinterpreted through a lens of divine justice. Her vilification serves to sanctify the prophetic critique of idolatry and centralized, centralized religious reform under kings like Hezekiah and Josiah. Yet, this narrative masks deeper tensions: Ahab and Jezebel's rule coincided with economic expansion—expanding trade networks, temple construction, and royal patronage—suggesting that their religious policies may have been tied to consolidating elite power rather than pure theological zealotry.
