The initial suspicion centered on a network so opaque that it defied conventional investigative models—requiring not just reporting, but forensic data reconstruction, legal navigation, and real-time geopolitical risk assessment. The project launched formally in April 2023, not as a single exposé, but as a 12-week longitudinal study—designed to trace capital, intent, and consequence across jurisdictions, institutions, and decades. The scope was ambitious: to map the architecture of influence behind what experts began to term “strategic opacity,” where financial flows masked geopolitical ambition, and where the line between sovereign investment and strategic coercion blurred. The team assembled a polyglot, polylegal team of 87 specialists—journalists embedded in 14 countries, data analysts parsing terabytes of leaked filings, forensic accountants tracing capital via blockchain analytics, and legal advisors dissecting jurisdictional loopholes in real time. At its core, Genesis A was not merely about uncovering “bad actors,” but about diagnosing a systemic failure in global transparency. Initial interviews with reformist regulators in Abu Dhabi and Doha revealed a dual logic: public branding as sustainable investors, private alignment with national security objectives. The team cross-referenced project tender documents with beneficial ownership registries—only to find widespread gaps, often filled by nominee directors in offshore jurisdictions with no real operational ties. Simultaneously, the project turned to Eastern Europe, where a parallel network of Eastern European private equity firms—many with historical ties to former intelligence agencies—had secured contracts for cyber infrastructure and digital governance platforms. These deals, structured through layered holding companies in Cyprus and Luxembourg, raised red flags about data sovereignty and potential foreign influence operations. Interviews with former financial regulators highlighted systemic failure: anti-money laundering (AML) and know-your-customer (KYC) frameworks were outdated, designed for centralized corruption, not decentralized financial networks. The investigation concluded that current tools were not just inadequate—they were obsolete.

Weeks 11–12 synthesized findings into a global risk model, identifying 52 high-consequence nodes—entities, jurisdictions, and financial instruments most vulnerable to misuse.
