Geopolitically, the early Jacobean era was marked by England’s nascent imperial ambitions and fears of internal subversion—echoes that reverberate in contemporary statecraft. The Gunpowder Plot of 1605, a failed Catholic conspiracy to blow up Parliament, intensified anxieties about treason and loyalty, themes central to Macbeth’s paranoia. Shakespeare, writing under James I—who claimed descent from Macbeth’s kinship—crafted a narrative that warned against regicide while subtly legitimizing the new Stewart monarch. The play’s tone thus oscillates between critique and complicity, a duality that enriches its enduring relevance. Modern parallels are striking. The play’s exploration of political
