Its vivid narratives—of ghostly horse sightings in Florida swamps, of Vodou rituals in Port-au-Prince, of elders recounting ancestral journeys—resonated with a public hungry for authentic Black expression. For the Harlem Renaissance, **Tell My Horse** was a bridge. Figures like Alain Locke and W.E.B. Du Bois championed art that celebrated Black culture, but Hurston's approach diverged. Where Locke emphasized artistic elevation, Hurston honored the raw, unpolished voice of everyday people. Her work prefigured later movements—African American Studies, cultural memory projects, and oral history initiatives—that reject academic abstraction in favor of lived truth. The book also influenced anthropology. Though Hurston was not trained in formal ethnography, her immersive method inspired later scholars to prioritize narrative and participant voice. Contemporary anthropologists cite her as a precursor to “participant-observation” that centers subjectivity. Scholars in South Africa, Brazil, and the Caribbean now draw on her methods to document marginalized voices—whether San bushmen in Namibia or Afro-Brazilian capoeira practitioners. The horse, in her hands, becomes a universal symbol: of resilience under oppression, of cultural continuity, and of the power of voice to resist erasure.

guidelines in anthropology, journalism, and development studies. Looking ahead, Hurston's legacy is evolving.
