The Deccan Plateau, with its volcanic soils and mineral wealth, became a stronghold of decentralized kingdoms—Cholas, Vijayanagara, Marathas—resisting centralized control for centuries. The Himalayan north, with its formidable mountains, created natural frontiers that historically limited invasion but also isolated communities, fostering distinct ethno-linguistic enclaves. The coastal plains—Konkan, Coromandel, Malabar—facilitated maritime trade, linking India to Mesopotamia, the Roman Empire, and later European powers, embedding economic openness into regional identities. This geographic diversity, however, was never matched by political unity. The Mughal Empire, though vast, governed through a network of semi-autonomous governors, allowing regional potentates to retain local authority. The British colonial era imposed a new spatial logic: provinces like Bengal, Punjab, and Madras were administratively defined more by revenue potential and strategic control than cultural coherence. The 1947 Partition, driven by religious cartography, superimposed a new geopolitical order, severing ancient trade and kinship networks. The resulting map—divided into 28 states and 8 union territories—was a compromise between colonial legacy and nationalist demands, yet it failed to resolve underlying tensions,

especially in Jammu and Kashmir, where competing claims over territory, identity, and sovereignty remain unresolved. Economically, the political map reflects disparities rooted in geography and history. The coastal states—Gujarat, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu—benefit from early access to global trade, fertile plains, and dense infrastructure. Inland regions, particularly in central and eastern India, face challenges of connectivity and access to markets. The “Blue Revolution” in Kerala’s coastal zones contrasts sharply with the agrarian distress in Bundelkhand or the Naxal-affected belts of Chhattisgarh. This spatial inequality fuels demands for greater fiscal decentralization and regional development, challenging the central state’s capacity to deliver equitable growth.

Industrial Geography and the Political Economy of Development

India’s political map is increasingly defined by industrial corridors and special economic zones that reflect a strategic shift toward spatial economic integration. The Delhi-Mumbai Industrial Corridor (DMIC), spanning seven states, exemplifies this transformation—linking logistics hubs, industrial clusters, and urban centers to create a high-capacity economic spine. Similarly, the Delhi-Kolkata Industrial Corridor and the Chennai-Bengaluru Industrial Belt aim to reduce regional disparities by concentrating investment in underdeveloped zones. These projects are not merely infrastructural; they are political acts, reshaping the map by redirecting capital, talent, and employment toward previously marginalized regions. Yet, this integration reveals entrenched asymmetries. States like Karnataka and Tamil Nadu leverage historical industrial legacies and skilled labor pools, while Bihar and Odisha struggle with inadequate power supply, poor connectivity, and bureaucratic inertia. The “growth triangle” of Bengaluru, Hyderabad, and Pune illustrates a new urban hierarchy, where tech and services cluster in coastal or semi-coastal zones, leaving hinterlands behind. This spatial polarization risks deepening political fault lines, as regions excluded from growth narratives grow increasingly alienated from the center. The rise of “smart cities” and special economic zones (SEZs) further complicates the political geography. While SEZs in Gujarat and Maharashtra attract foreign investment and export-oriented industries, they often operate as regulatory enclaves, outside state taxation and labor laws, raising questions about equitable development and democratic accountability. The political map, therefore, becomes a patchwork of integration and exclusion—where economic modernization advances unevenly, reinforcing both opportunity and inequality.

Geopolitical Positioning and Strategic Spatiality

China’s proximity and contested borders in Ladakh underscore how terrain influences strategic vulnerability and infrastructure investment, including the expansion of highways, airbases, and surveillance systems. The southern peninsula, with its deep-water ports and proximity to the Strait of Malacca, enhances India’s blue-water naval ambitions and Indo-Pacific outreach, evident in initiatives like the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative. This strategic geography fuels India’s growing role in multilateral frameworks—from the Quad to BRICS—and drives defense and infrastructure investments that reshape

regional power dynamics. Yet, internal territorial disputes and border friction with China and Pakistan reveal the limits of spatial dominance, where physical borders are both assets and liabilities in a contested geopolitical landscape.

Expert Perspectives and the Future of Federal Cohesion

Scholars and policymakers emphasize that India’s political map is not just a static boundary but a dynamic field of negotiation—between center and states, center and communities, tradition and transformation. Pratinav Bhattacharya, in his analysis of federalism, argues that India’s resilience lies in its “asymmetric pluralism”—the capacity to accommodate diversity without fragmentation. Yet, rising regionalism, often fueled by identity politics, challenges this equilibrium. The emergence of regional parties with strong autonomist agendas—from the DMK in Tamil Nadu to the Samajwadi Party in Uttar Pradesh—reflects a demand for greater self-determination, sometimes at the expense of national cohesion. Christophe Jaffrelot, a leading expert on Indian nationalism, cautioned as early as the 1990s that India’s democratic model hinges on its ability to manage cultural pluralism without succumbing to majoritarianism. His work highlights the paradox: while India’s constitution enshrines secularism and federalism, political practices often privilege linguistic and cultural major
