Iyengar in the mid-20th century, introduced precision in joint articulation, muscle engagement, and breath coordination—transforming yoga into a performative yet disciplined physical discipline. This shift, while enhancing accessibility, also initiated a tension between traditional *sadhana*—rooted in patience, humility, and inner reflection—and a contemporary performance culture driven by aesthetics, social media validation, and measurable outcomes. According to a 2023 report by the Indian Yoga Association, the global yoga economy exceeds \$150 billion annually, driven by wellness tourism, corporate wellness programs, app-based instruction, and branded apparel. India's government has formalized this economic potential through initiatives like the International Yoga Day (observed annually on June 21 since 2015) and the establishment of Yoga Universities, positioning yoga as a soft power asset in geopolitical discourse. China, Brazil, and Turkey have followed suit, adapting yoga to national identities—blending local movement traditions with classical *āsana*—to assert cultural sovereignty and economic competitiveness. Yet this commercialization has sparked critical debate. Scholars such as Mark Singleton, in his seminal work *Yoga: The Origins of Physical Practice* (2010), challenge the myth of yoga's unbroken lineage from ancient asceticism to modern postural yoga, arguing that many popular *āsanas* were codified in the 20th century under colonial and postcolonial pressures. Neurobiological studies reveal how specific postures modulate autonomic function, stress response, and cognitive performance. For instance, *Bakasana* (Crow Pose)

In Turkey, state-supported *yoga* initiatives promote national identity through a synthesis of Central Asian movement traditions and Indian *āsana*. These regional inflections reveal yoga’s plasticity, yet also expose power dynamics: Western institutions often dominate the narrative, marginalizing local epistemologies and reducing yoga to a universalized, decontextualized practice. The future of yoga anatomy and mindful postures hinges on reconciling tradition with innovation. Emerging technologies—AI-assisted alignment feedback, motion-capture biomechanics, virtual reality immersion—offer unprecedented opportunities for personalized practice. Initiatives like the *Yoga Dharma Research Institute* in Karnataka and *Ananda Shambhala* in Nepal emphasize lineage integrity, intergenerational transmission, and ethical practice as foundational to sustainable evolution. Geopolitically, yoga’s role is shifting. As nations compete for soft power, yoga becomes a site of cultural diplomacy. India’s “Yoga Diplomacy” includes bilateral agreements with over 80 countries, while China promotes *Tai Chi*—a close kin—through Confucian cultural centers. The European Union has funded yoga-based mental health programs in post-conflict zones, acknowledging its potential beyond wellness into social healing. Yet this institutional embrace risks instrumentalization: reducing yoga to a tool for economic or political gain may dilute its transformative potential. Economically, the sector faces a reckoning.
