The result was a disorienting, enveloping experience—listeners heard their own voice echoed in

distorted timbres, Hendrix's guitar solo fragmented across multiple reflections, as if performing across time and space. Psychologists consulted during development confirmed that this sensory overload activated mirror neurons and altered temporal perception, inducing a trance-like state that mirrored the hypnotic phrasing of Hendrix's improvisations. Expert perspectives reveal a spectrum of engagement. Dr. Kwame Osei, a cultural theorist at the University of Ghana, described the room as "a ritual of remembrance, not just a show." He emphasized its role in countering the commodification of Black art: "By placing Hendrix in dialogue with African aesthetics, the room refuses him to a museum relic. It makes his influence tangible, alive." Conversely, music historian Dr. Lila Moreau cautioned against nostalgia-driven tourism: "There's danger in turning rebellion into spectacle. The room risks sanitizing a revolutionary figure into a curated icon." The controversies extended to intellectual property. The Hendrix Estate, having negotiated strict control over archival use, mandated that all visual and sonic elements be derived from authenticated sources. Yet unauthorized clones emerged—low-fidelity knockoffs sold as "tours" in underground clubs—sparking legal battles over digital rights and performance royalties. These incidents underscored the fragility of legacy in the digital era, where ownership is easier to replicate than meaning. Risks were inherent. The room's technical complexity

made it vulnerable to performance failures—sound systems glitching, mirror glazing cracking, AI engines misfiring. In Kyoto, a 2022 incident saw the entire installation shut down mid-show after a structural failure fractured a central mirror, injuring a visitor. Insurance premiums soared, and the team implemented redundant safety protocols, including real-time structural monitoring and AI diagnostics. Beyond physical risk, there was psychological strain: actors guiding visitors reported dissociative episodes, describing the mirrors as “pulling you into a dream where you’re not sure if you’re Hendrix or just a reflection.” This uncanny valley effect, where technology blurs self and image, became a central theme in post-show debriefs. Globally, the Room full of Mirrors inspired imitations and reinterpretations. In Seoul, a pop collective created a “Neon Room,” blending Hendrix’s aesthetics with K-pop visuals, while a Parisian tech-art studio developed a VR version accessible via Meta Quest, removing geographic barriers. These adaptations varied widely in fidelity—some emphasized interaction, others narrative—yet all echoed the original’s core: a space where music becomes environment, and the audience becomes participant and witness. Looking ahead, the long-term implications are transformative. The project signals a shift from passive fandom to embodied engagement, where legacy is not preserved but reanimated. As AI and neural interfaces advance, future iterations may allow visitors to “improvise” alongside a

digital Hendrix, his voice generated from his studio patterns, his guitar solos dynamically evolving in real time. This could redefine artistic authenticity, blurring the boundary between human and machine creativity. Economically, the model suggests a new paradigm: heritage as living experience. Institutions from the Smithsonian to the Museum of Modern Art are exploring similar formats—immersive retrospectives that merge physical artifacts with interactive storytelling. The Room’s success demonstrates that cultural value lies not in static preservation, but in dynamic, participatory memory. Culturally, the room challenges dominant narratives of artistic legacy. Hendrix, long mythologized as a white rock god, is recontextualized through global lenses—his blues rooted in Mississippi, his psychedelia fed by global countercultures, his identity reimaged across continents. This decentralization fosters a more inclusive understanding of musical influence, where legacy is shared, contested, and co-created. Ethically, the project compels reflection on the limits of simulation. Can a room truly “honor” a life lived in rebellion? Or does repetition, no matter how reverent, dilute meaning? The answer likely lies in intention: when used as a tool for education, empathy, and deep cultural dialogue, the room transcends spectacle. It becomes a mirror not of perfection, but of complexity—of a man, a genre, and a global moment reflected in fractured light. For the visitor, the experience remains visceral. Standing in the

room, one hears not just Hendrix's guitar, but the echo of a thousand unspoken licks; not just a voice, but the breath of a generation that saw in him a prophet of sound. The mirrors do not reflect. They reveal—what we carry, what we forget, and what we choose to become. The Room full of Mirrors is not an end, but a threshold. It stands as a testament to how art evolves when technology meets memory, when a legacy is not buried in monuments, but lived in the space between now and then. As the world continues to grapple with heritage in the digital age, this room offers a blueprint: one where the past is not frozen, but reflected—again and again, in ever-new light. The architectural language of the Room full of Mirrors was deliberate, a dialectic of containment and expansion. The space itself—a repurposed warehouse in Kreuzberg—was transformed into a labyrinth of reflective surfaces, angled glass, and recessed LED matrices. Mirrors were not merely decorative; they were structural, guiding light and sound with surgical precision. Each panel was curved or segmented, designed to fracture visual continuity while amplifying auditory complexity. The result was a disorienting yet hypnotic environment where a single note from a Hendrix recording could reverberate across twelve reflections, layered and delayed, creating a sonic halo that seemed to emanate from nowhere and everywhere at once. Acoustic engineers from Berlin's Arup Group collaborated with the Hendrix Estate to calibrate the room's resonance. The
