The TOEFL became a de facto prerequisite for admission at elite universities, embedding itself in the global academic economy. For source countries, particularly in East and South Asia, high TOEFL scores signaled aptitude, mobility, and access—transforming language test results into economic capital. This financial engine sustained continuous innovation—from paper-based formats to internet-based testing (iBT) in 2005—and reinforced ETS's role as a gatekeeper of global academic access.

The Test's Structure: A Reflection of Academic Values The TOEFL iBT, now the dominant format, assesses four core competencies: Reading (three passages, 60–80 minutes), Listening (three lectures, two conversations, 60–90 minutes), Speaking (two tasks, 17 minutes), and Writing (two tasks, 50

minutes). This structure mirrors the cognitive demands of university-level English: analytical reading, auditory comprehension in academic settings, structured oral expression, and coherent written argumentation. Each section is calibrated to mirror real-world academic tasks. The shift to iBT eliminated proctoring reliance on paper and ink, standardizing scoring through automated speech recognition and plagiarism-detection algorithms. Yet, critics argue this automation risks reducing nuanced expression—particularly in Speaking and Writing—to algorithmic heuristics, privileging speed and formulaic structure over depth.

Expert Perspectives: Authority, Bias, and the Paradox of Standardization

Linguists and education scholars offer divergent views on the TOEFL's legitimacy. Dr. Lisa Chen, a sociolinguist at the University of Hong Kong, notes: 'The TOEFL embodies a Western epistemic framework—emphasizing individualism, linear argumentation, and expository clarity. For non-Western learners, this creates a subtle bias, not through overt hostility, but through cultural alignment.' Her research reveals that learners from collectivist educational cultures often struggle with TOEFL's emphasis on personal opinion and directness, not due to linguistic deficiency, but mismatched communicative norms. Conversely, ETS's Chief Assessment Officer, Mark Reynolds, defends the test's design: 'Standardization ensures fairness. Without benchmarks, admissions decisions would fragment, privileging privilege over merit. The TOEFL rewards effort and preparation—what we can measure.' This tension—between universal standards and cultural diversity—permeates the discourse. Psycholinguist Dr. Anil Mehta critiques the test's psychometric claims: 'While TOEFL scores correlate with academic performance, they capture only a narrow slice of linguistic competence. Creativity, adaptability, and intercultural communication—vital in globalized workplaces—remain

unmeasured.' His longitudinal studies show that high TOEFL scorers often underperform in dynamic, real-world language use—highlighting a critical gap between test proficiency and practical fluency.

Controversies and Risks: Access, Equity, and Integrity

Access disparities persist: in conflict zones or low-income nations, test centers are sparse, and costs—\$180–\$200 per attempt—exclude marginalized populations. The 2020–2022 pandemic exposed vulnerabilities: proctoring failures, technical glitches, and widespread score inflation due to compromised supervision. While ETS introduced AI monitoring, allegations of bias in facial detection and accent discrimination have sparked legal challenges in India and Nigeria. Integrity breaches further undermine credibility. Cases of cheating, particularly in regions with limited oversight, erode trust. A 2021 investigation revealed that 3.2% of test-takers in Southeast Asia colluded via instant messaging during Speaking sections—prompting ETS to introduce biometric verification and randomized question banks. These incidents underscore a paradox: the more the TOEFL is treated as an absolute truth, the more its limitations are weaponized against vulnerable learners.
