tenancy. This blurring challenges traditional legal categories: when a property is rented via a short-term platform, is it a rental agreement or a commercial lease? Spanish courts have begun to clarify—emphasizing intent and duration—but regulatory gaps remain, creating legal ambiguity exploited by unscrupulous operators. Technological disruption further complicates the landscape. Smart contracts, blockchain-based registration, and AI-driven lease negotiations promise efficiency but risk marginalizing vulnerable tenants. Without robust oversight, digital rental forms may entrench exclusion, privileging tech-savvy landlords and disempowering those with limited digital access.

This “gigarral” sector—particularly in tourism zones—thrives on opacity, enabling rent increases beyond legal limits and evasion of safety inspections. The 2021 **Ley de Vivienda Turística** attempted to regulate short-term rentals, but enforcement remains patchy, leaving traditional tenants exposed. Legal scholars warn that without systemic reform—enhanced tenant legal aid, digital literacy programs, and stricter penalties for non-compliance—the rental agreement risks becoming a tool of exclusion rather than stability.
