But I see it as theft.” These testimonies became the foundation of his insistence that theology must be tested not in doctrine, but in the lived experiences of the vulnerable. Waje’s early writings, including essays published in *The Nigerian Journal of Theology*, wove together Tiv proverbs, biblical exegesis, and structural analysis. He introduced the concept of “sacred ground”—a metaphysical and geographical space where faith, land, and memory converge. To defile sacred ground, he argued, was not merely a moral transgression but a rupture of the collective soul. This idea, rooted in Tiv land ethics, challenged both secular nationalism and religious fundamentalism, which often reduced faith to ideology or identity.
