Although PDFs are stable, technology continues to evolve. Using widely supported features and avoiding proprietary extensions improves long-term compatibility. Regularly reviewing tools and standards helps keep American Curves June 2006 Single Issue Magazine Issue 25 usable across future platforms.

Future-proofing also involves maintaining editable source files alongside PDFs. This practice allows efficient updates and ensures adaptability as requirements change.

Final thoughts on PDF creation and maintenance

Creating and maintaining high-quality PDFs requires thoughtful planning, consistent formatting, and ongoing care.
