In this vacuum, traditional governance collapsed. Courts ceased functioning. Oil terminals were seized and blockaded. Civilians lived under constant threat—from sniper fire, IEDs, and arbitrary detentions. The

absence of state infrastructure created a demand for alternative security: informal guards, scout units, and intelligence cells. These were not hired by a central authority but emerged organically, often led by former soldiers, tribal elders, or defectors who had once served Gaddafi but now saw opportunity in alignment with local resistance. The secret soldiers were not trained in formal academies. Many were ex-Gaddafi officers disillusioned by the regime's collapse, or tribal rangers with ancestral knowledge of the desert. They learned on the job—tracking IEDs, deciphering radio chatter, navigating shifting alliances. Their tools were basic: binoculars, satellite phones, and a network of informants embedded in markets, mosques, and refugee camps. Trust was the only currency. Their first major test came in April 2012, when a coalition of Islamist militias began consolidating control over southern Benghazi. The group, later linked to Ansar al-Sharia, aimed to impose strict sharia governance and seize infrastructure. The emerging resistance, still uncoordinated, faced annihilation. It was then that a core group of scouts—many with prior intelligence experience—began organizing a covert response. Led by figures like Khalid al-Sharif, a former army sergeant turned resistance coordinator, they established a decentralized command structure, relying on coded

messages and night patrols. This early phase laid the foundation for what would become the 13-hour operational surge. The soldiers operated in cells—small, self-sufficient groups that communicated through pre-arranged signals and safe houses. Their mission: gather intelligence on militia movements, protect civilians from raids, and relay information to emerging leadership. The name “13 Hours” crystallized during one critical night in August 2012, when a coordinated assault was detected. The scouts intercepted communications, identified targets, and enabled a preemptive strike that disrupted the assault and saved hundreds. This event marked a turning point.
