Educational institutions increasingly draw from Visva-Bharati's model, integrating hospitality into curricula as a pedagogical tool for empathy and intercultural competence. Tech platforms experimenting with "digital *atithi*" spaces—virtual guesthouses for global dialogue—test Tagore's relevance in cyberspace. His vision also informs emerging frameworks of "cultural diplomacy," where soft power is not wielded by states alone, but by individuals and communities. Yet challenges persist. Can *atithi* survive commodification as a brand? Can hospitality remain authentic amid tourism and datafication? Tagore's answer lies in intentionality: the *atithi* was never about spectacle, but about the courage to be present—to one's neighbor, to one's history, and to the
