Community leader and rootworker Marissa "Mama Root" Dubois, based in New Orleans, provides a grounded voice: "We don't sell power—we guard it. Our rituals are for healing, protection, and community. When outsiders come asking for 'how-to' without respect, they miss the heart of it. That's why we teach selectively, protect sacred knowledge, and demand reciprocity." Her practice blends ancestral roots with modern ethics, mentoring youth to become not just users, but stewards. Dr. Elena Petrova, a historian of esoteric traditions at the Sorbonne, contextualizes hoodoo within the broader history of occult economies. She notes that the 20th century saw spiritual practices become commodities—from Thelemic writings to crystal healing—but only
