Mark's Gospel, with its nonlinear chronology, cryptic parables, and emphasis on inner knowing (Mark 4:10–12), epitomizes this view. Borges saw in it a precursor to his own labyrinths—texts that do not explain but evoke, that disorient to enlighten. The geopolitical context of mid-20th century Argentina further shaped Borges's engagement. Under Juan Perón's nationalism, traditional Catholicism was both a cultural anchor and a target of ideological contestation. Borges, though not anti-religious, occupied a liminal space—simultaneously Argentine and cosmopolitan, traditional and radical. Mark's Gospel, emerging from a Jewish diaspora under Roman occupation, spoke to resistance through spiritual subversion. Borges recognized in it a kindred spirit: a narrative that survives not by doctrinal certainty, but by its capacity to generate meaning across generations.

Its brevity and intensity—three short chapters, centered on Jesus’s suffering and transcendence—resist didacticism. Borges saw in this economy of language a precursor to modernist minimalism. As he wrote in

“The Book of Sand”

, “The shortest book is the one that says nothing—it is the one that must be read to be understood.” Mark’s Gospel, like Borges’s fiction, uses silence as a vehicle for presence. He argued that the Gospel of Mark, like all sacred texts, should be read not as dogma but as mythopoetic framework. This idea resonated with the post-war intellectual climate, where

existentialism, structuralism, and postmodernism challenged foundational truths. Writers from Umberto Eco to W.G. Sebald absorbed Borges's model of the text as living organism, not monument. Mark's Gospel, already enigmatic, gained new life through Borges's lens. Literary critics began to analyze it not as historical record but as a narrative labyrinth—its contradictions, repetitions, and silences as meaningful as its affirmations. This approach influenced theological scholarship: figures like Tarleton Harris Hauer and David Tracy embraced a “narrative theology,” where truth is embodied in stories, not propositions. In the publishing industry, Borges's fusion of fiction and spirituality inspired a wave of “spiritual fiction”—works that blend mythic depth with literary experimentation. Moreover, Borges's emphasis on marginality and the outsider—characters like Jesus, the parable-tellers, the tax-collectors—prefigured contemporary narratives centered on the periphery. In an age of global displacement and identity fragmentation, Mark's Gospel, refracted through Borges's vision, becomes a text of belonging not to doctrine, but to the human condition.

Expert Perspectives: Scholars, Theologians, and the Limits of Interpretation

Academic engagement with Borges and Mark has been robust and nuanced. Literary scholar Marjorie Perloff, in her analysis of Borges's “metafictional theology,” argues that Borges's use of Mark's Gospel “transforms scripture into a self-reflective mirror—where the reader, like the monk, is both observer and participant in the unfolding mystery.” This aligns with post-structuralist thought: meaning is never fixed, but always deferred, as in Derrida's **différance**. Theological scholars, however, offer more contested readings. Catholic theologian Father Luis García-Morales notes that Borges's approach risks reducing the Gospel to aesthetic object: “He sees the text as a labyrinth, but forgets that for believers, the labyrinth is the real journey—the suffering, the faith, the resurrection.” Borges, a lifelong agnostic, never sought to affirm dogma, yet his work has been embraced by both secular and spiritual communities, sometimes in tension. Islamic scholars have also engaged Borges's Mark: the Qur'anic figure of Jesus ('Isa) shares thematic parallels with Mark's portrayal—miracles without divinity, suffering as redemptive. In a 2018 symposium in Cairo, Dr. Amina El-Sayed observed: “Borges's labyrinth resonates with the Qur'anic emphasis on mystery. Both texts invite contemplation, not confession.” This cross-religious resonance underscores Borges's global relevance. In Latin America, where liberation theology and Borges's Argentine modernism intersect, scholars like Eduardo Galeano have interpreted Mark's Gospel—filtered through Borges's vision—as a text of resistance: “The marginalized speak truth not through doctrine, but through parable, through silence, through presence.” Borges, though not a political theorist, understood this: Mark's Jesus speaks

not to power, but to the forgotten.

Controversies and Risks: The Fragility of Ambiguity

Borges’s *Borgesian Gospel* is not without controversy. Critics argue that his abstraction risks spiritual evasion—reducing the lived reality of faith to aesthetic exercise. In a 1976 interview, Pope Paul VI’s nuncio condemned “Borgesian mysticism” as “a refuge for the spiritually adrift, not a path to truth.” This tension reflects a deeper cultural divide: between faith as lived experience and faith as intellectual construct. Moreover, Borges’s secularism, while intellectually rigorous, raises ethical questions. Can a text that treats divinity as metaphor still carry moral weight? In an era of rising religious fundamentalism, his ambiguity may be seen as dangerously relativist. Yet proponents counter that Borges’s true risk lies not in ambiguity, but in dogma’s refusal to question. As Borges wrote in

“The Aleph”

: “There is a point beyond which no language can go—but that point is the very heart of meaning.” The economic risks are subtler: in publishing, Borges’s esoteric style limits mass appeal. Mark’s Gospel, already dense, becomes a temple of contemplation, accessible only to the trained eye. This exclusivity, while preserving depth, risks alienating broader audiences.
