This convergence of physical and digital transforms cut-and-paste exercises from static paper tasks into dynamic, data-rich interfaces. Yet, this innovation deepens structural inequities: schools in high-income nations afford interactive, subsidized worksheets, while low-income regions rely on printed, outdated versions—often translated from foreign curricula with little cultural relevance. From a cognitive science perspective, the pedagogical value of cut-and-paste activities is nuanced. Research in developmental psychology confirms that hands-on manipulation strengthens memory encoding, fine motor skills, and conceptual understanding—particularly in early literacy and numeracy. In contrast, open educational resource (OER) initiatives—such as the OpenStax project—promote free, customizable worksheets, empowering educators to adapt content without proprietary constraints. Controversies, Risks, and Equity Gaps

But in low-resource settings, printers, ink, and internet access remain barriers. A 2021 UNESCO report found that 60% of 2nd graders in conflict
