as a form of market intelligence. Investors and advertisers use it to assess ROI on local campaigns, while broadcasters leverage it to benchmark performance against peers. In a landscape where national networks often overlook rural and midwestern markets, the guide empowers local stations to prove their relevance—securing sponsorships, attracting talent, and justifying infrastructure investments.

Industry Impact: From Gatekeepers to Algorithmic Gatekeepers
