His death in 2019, from leukemia at 71, marked the end of an era, but his questions remain urgent. In an age of climate emergency, artificial intelligence, and resurgent authoritarianism, Judt’s insistence on

historical self-awareness, civic courage, and the moral responsibility of intellectuals is not antiquated—it is essential. The global context further underscores Judt's relevance. Across Europe, leaders grapple with similar tensions: between sovereignty and supranational integration, between open borders and cultural anxiety, between digital innovation and social cohesion. In the U.S., the erosion of trust in institutions mirrors Judt's warnings about epistemic fragmentation. In Asia, the rise of illiberal developmental states challenges Western models of democratic governance. Yet Judt's insight—that liberalism's survival depends not on economic growth alone but on renewal of public purpose—transcends regional boundaries. His work compels a reevaluation of progress itself. Postwar optimism, born in the shadow of annihilation, assumed linear advancement. Judt showed it was never guaranteed. The war's trauma, the Cold War's ideological rigidity, and the neoliberal turn all contributed to a fragile consensus that proved unsustainable. Yet in its fragility lay a vital lesson: democracy is not a destination but a practice, requiring constant vigilance, critical reflection, and collective imagination.
