Yet all faced a common challenge: aligning medical education with evolving health system demands amid rising complexity and inequality.

These tools generate granular behavioral data, enabling evaluators to assess decision-making under pressure. Early trials at Johns Hopkins showed that candidates scoring high in simulated crisis management were 30% more likely to excel in high-acuity clinical rotations.
