Critics within the culinary elite accused him of ideological rigidity, claiming his emphasis on "authenticity" risked fossilizing tradition and alienating younger generations. Others questioned his alignment with certain anti-globalization currents, warning against romanticizing pre-industrial models in an era of climate urgency. Carluccio responded by refining his stance: authenticity, he argued, was not static but adaptive—rooted in community, responsive to change, and inclusive of innovation that honored origin.
