On the other, scholars such as Dr. Steve Silberman, author of and critical voice on neurodiversity, argue that mainstream ABA perpetuates a deficit model, ignoring the social model of disability that attributes barriers to environmental design, not behavior. This tension reflects a broader disciplinary rift: behaviorism as science versus behaviorism as social engineering. The risks embedded in ABA exams are not merely clinical but systemic. The Nordic emphasis on inclusive education and early childhood support contrasts sharply with the U.S.-style diagnostic gatekeeping, where access to services hinges on ABA-based evaluations. In Japan, cultural norms around social harmony influence the interpretation of behavior, leading to modified ABA approaches that downplay individual reinforcement in favor of group-based harmony-building strategies. These variations highlight how ABA exams are not universal truths but culturally mediated instruments, shaped by local values and institutional priorities. Looking forward, the future of ABA exams is poised at a crossroads. Advances in artificial intelligence and machine learning offer the potential for adaptive, dynamic assessments—real-time analysis of behavioral patterns from multimodal data.
