In Europe, the Maastricht Treaty and subsequent harmonization efforts failed to close cross-border gaps, enabling traders to exploit jurisdictional differences. Meanwhile, in emerging markets—from Shanghai to São Paulo—state-controlled exchanges and nascent regulatory frameworks struggled to contain speculative excesses, often allowing naked positions to metastasize under weak enforcement. The evolution of naked trading is inseparable from technological transformation. The advent of electronic trading platforms in the 1990s and 2000s democratized access but also magnified risk. High-frequency trading algorithms, capable of executing thousands of trades per second, exploited latency arbitrage and informational asymmetries. In this environment, naked strategies—once constrained by manual execution and physical delivery—found new life in hidden order flows, dark pools, and off-exchange venues.
