The 1919 redlining maps of the Home Owners’ Loan Corporation (HOLC) carved neighborhoods into zones of “hazard” and “desirable,” systematically denying Black families access to mortgages, credit, and municipal investment. This institutionalized segregation transformed once-promising areas like Bronzeville—once a beacon of Black intellectual and cultural life—into zones of concentrated poverty. By the 1950s, the southern stretch of the South Side was already a landscape of decaying infrastructure, overcrowded housing, and failing schools, yet it remained a center of Black entrepreneurship, music, and political organizing. The industrial collapse of the mid-20th century accelerated the unraveling. As meatpacking plants closed—Bryan Farms, Swift, and Armour—jobs vanished overnight. The 1970s and 1980s brought deindustrialization on a scale that reshaped not just economies but identities. When the

last major factory shuttered in 1985, the South Side lost over 40,000 factory jobs in a decade. Unemployment soared, reaching 25% by 1990, and poverty rates doubled.
