By the early 20th century, adhesives had become strategic assets. During World War I, the demand for lightweight, durable bonding materials surged. The British military, facing shortages of rivets and welds in aircraft construction, turned to phenolic resins and epoxy systems—materials that offered superior strength-to-weight ratios and resistance to extreme temperatures. This shift marked a turning point: adhesives were no longer auxiliary but central to technological and military superiority. The U.S. entry into the war accelerated research, with institutions like the National Bureau of Standards (now NIST) formalizing the first systematic studies of bond strength, curing dynamics, and surface compatibility. These efforts laid the groundwork for the postwar explosion of polymer science. The *Handbook of Adhesives and Surface Preparation*, as a modern reference, encapsulates over a century of this evolution. This imbalance creates strategic vulnerabilities: supply chain disruptions in key precursor chemicals can ripple through automotive, aerospace, and renewable energy sectors. The 2021 Suez Canal blockage, for example, delayed shipments of methyl methacrylate-based adhesives critical to wind turbine blade manufacturing, highlighting the fragility of global adhesive logistics. Economically, adhesives have redefined manufacturing paradigms. Traditional mechanical fastening—rivets, welds, bolts—imposes geometric constraints and adds weight. Adhesives enable seamless, lightweight assemblies: aircraft fuselages bonded rather than riveted, electric vehicle batteries secured with thermally stable epoxies, and flexible electronics assembled without heat-sensitive soldering. This shift has catalyzed a structural realignment in industrial design, favoring modularity, recyclability, and performance optimization. The Handbook captures this shift through case

studies: the Boeing 787 Dreamliner uses over 1.5 million structural adhesives, reducing weight by 20% compared to aluminum riveted joints, while enabling faster assembly and lower maintenance costs. Yet this progress is not without controversy. The environmental footprint of adhesives has come under intense scrutiny. Volatile organic compounds (VOCs) emitted during solvent-based adhesive application contribute significantly to urban air pollution and ozone formation. Despite bans in many high-income markets, legacy products continue to pose exposure risks in informal manufacturing zones and aging infrastructure across Southeast Asia and Africa. The Handbook's risk assessment section underscores the importance of lifecycle analysis: from raw material sourcing to end-of-life disposal, each stage carries distinct hazards that demand rigorous mitigation strategies. Expert perspectives reveal a field in flux. The global adhesive industry, though often overshadowed by metals, plastics, or electronics, is a critical node in the modern industrial web—one shaped by geopolitical currents, resource geopolitics, and shifting trade alliances. Its evolution cannot be understood in isolation; rather, it reflects broader patterns of economic power, technological competition, and environmental reckoning. At the core of this ecosystem lies a paradox: adhesives enable lightweight, high-performance materials essential for decarbonization—such as carbon-fiber-reinforced polymers in electric vehicles and wind turbine blades—yet their production and disposal carry significant ecological burdens. Countries rich in crude oil—Saudi Arabia, Russia, the United States—control a foundational element of adhesive chemistry, granting them outsized influence over pricing and availability. This dependency has prompted strategic diversification efforts, particularly in the European Union and East Asia, where initiatives like the Circular Economy Action Plan incentivize bio-based adhesives and localized production hubs. China's emergence as a global adhesive powerhouse exemplifies this dynamic. Since the 2000s, Chinese manufacturers have leveraged low-cost

petrochemical feedstocks and aggressive R&D investment to capture over 35% of the global market by volume. Companies such as Sinochem's adhesives division and Zhejiang Juhua Group have deployed vertical integration—controlling everything from raw material sourcing to finished product—enabling rapid scaling and cost leadership. This dominance extends beyond economics: Chinese adhesive firms now supply over 40% of structural bonding systems used in Southeast Asian infrastructure projects, embedding their standards into regional construction codes. Yet this asymmetry generates strategic vulnerabilities. The 2021 Suez Canal blockage and the 2022 Russia-Ukraine conflict exposed how disruptions in key feedstock routes—such as ethylene or toluene—can cascade through adhesive supply chains, delaying production in automotive and aerospace sectors. In response, the U.S. Department of Defense has prioritized domestic production of high-performance epoxies and polyurethanes, funding pilot plants in Texas and Alabama to reduce reliance on foreign imports. Similarly, the EU's Horizon Europe program allocates €300 million annually to develop sovereign capabilities in sustainable adhesives, aiming to reduce dependency on Asian and Middle Eastern suppliers. The geopolitical dimension is further complicated by export controls and technology transfer restrictions. The U.S. Export Administration Regulations (EAR) now restrict the shipment of advanced polymer formulations deemed critical to national security, limiting access by allied nations in sensitive regions. Conversely, China's aggressive patenting strategy—over 12,000 adhesive-related patents filed between 2015 and 2023—positions it as a leader in next-generation materials, including self-healing polymers and conductive adhesives for flexible electronics. This intellectual arms race underscores adhesives not merely as industrial inputs, but as instruments of technological sovereignty. Trade agreements increasingly reflect these tensions. The Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) includes provisions for mutual recognition of adhesive safety standards, facilitating cross-border trade among 11 Pacific Rim nations. Yet regional blocs remain divided: the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) faces challenges in harmonizing adhesive regulations across 54 diverse economies, where informal markets dominate and raw material access is uneven. This fragmentation

hinders the scaling of sustainable adhesive solutions, particularly in regions with high infrastructure needs but limited regulatory capacity. The future of adhesive supply will thus be defined by three competing forces: decarbonization, digitalization, and geopolitical realignment. Bio-based feedstocks—derived from agricultural residues
