This method is effective but requires a degree of technical knowledge and awareness of the legal implications.

Several online platforms offer eBook format conversion services that can convert EPUB or PDF files to Kindle-compatible formats. However, most online services do not support DRM removal, meaning DRM-protected ADE files cannot be converted unless the DRM is removed beforehand.

Economically, Adobe's model reshaped the value chain. Traditionally, publishers relied on print distribution and physical retail margins.
