These conflicts did not merely displace millions—they fractured social contracts, destabilized family structures, and severed pathways to stable futures. Youth, particularly those born into or after such violence, became both victims and, often, the only viable agents of reconstruction. H.S. Shapiro's

pivotal insight emerged from fieldwork conducted in Lebanon's Shatila refugee camp, where Palestinian youth navigate overlapping layers of statelessness, poverty, and intergenerational trauma. Her 2018 investigative series, later expanded into a study titled _Education Beyond Survival_, revealed that in such contexts, formal schooling often fails to address the psychological wounds of violence. Students arrived with fragmented self-narratives, hyper-vigilance, and diminished trust in institutions. Traditional curricula—rooted in rote memorization and nationalistic narratives—did little to foster critical thinking or emotional regulation. In classrooms where teachers themselves had survived systemic neglect or direct violence, burnout and disengagement were common. The schoolhouse, instead of being a sanctuary, sometimes echoed the chaos outside: a microcosm of instability. Shapiro's analysis diverged from conventional reformist models by centering trauma-informed pedagogy not as an add-on, but as the foundational architecture of any viable educational system in post-violent societies. Drawing on neurobiological research, she emphasized that chronic exposure to violence alters brain development—impairing executive function, memory, and emotional regulation. Learning, in this light, could

not proceed normally without addressing the physiological and psychological residue of trauma. Yet, she rejected the notion that trauma resolution required specialized clinical interventions alone. Instead, she advocated for a holistic
