As media scholar Dr. Sofía Núñez observes, ‘These movements are not just surviving; they are redefining the boundaries of public discourse, inserting spiritual epistemologies into debates about justice, memory, and governance.’ Looking forward, the long-term implications of Diga’s praxis are significant. As democratic backsliding accelerates globally, the fusion of spiritual depth and civic engagement offers a sustainable model for resistance. Digital surveillance and AI-driven repression may intensify, but so too does the demand for authentic, human-centered leadership. Diga’s legacy lies not in institutional permanence, but in the cultivation of inner resilience and communal wisdom—qualities harder to suppress. Future projections suggest this model could scale through decentralized, networked structures. Blockchain-based mutual aid systems, encrypted spiritual forums, and peer-led training modules may enable wider dissemination without centralization. Moreover, as climate crises deepen displacement

and inequality, such movements are likely to expand into environmental stewardship—linking prayer to ecological restoration, framing care for creation as sacred duty. Yet challenges persist.
