Initially a niche column in newspapers, trivia served as a social lubricant—shared knowledge became a currency of conversation, especially in postwar communities where intergenerational exchange was both valued and constrained. But for seniors, trivia transcends leisure. It is a cognitive intervention. Neuroscientific research, particularly longitudinal studies by the University of California, San Diego, and the Max Planck Institute, confirms that engaging with factual recall—especially in social or structured

quiz formats—activates the hippocampus and prefrontal cortex, regions critical for memory consolidation and executive function. For aging brains, this is not trivial: it delays cognitive decline, reinforces neural plasticity, and fosters a sense of agency amid societal marginalization. The act of answering, especially in group settings, becomes a form of mental resistance against the erosion of identity. The geopolitical context of trivia's evolution reveals a subtle but profound shift. In the Cold War era, trivia lists were weaponized—both East and West curated “national knowledge” to assert ideological superiority. The Soviet Union's *Osoby Sledy* (Notable Figures) quiz series emphasized scientific and industrial achievements, while American game shows like *Family Feud* framed trivia as democratic meritocracy. Today, this legacy persists in state-sponsored cultural preservation efforts: Japan's *Kodomo no Trivia* (Children's Trivia) has expanded into senior-focused “Wisdom Quizzes,” blending historical facts with contemporary cultural literacy as part of national identity reinforcement. Economically, trivia has morphed from newspaper sidebars into a multibillion-dollar industry. The rise of digital platforms—Spotify's *The Trivia Podcast*, Netflix's *The Quiz Show*, and mobile apps like *QuizUp* and *TriviaNerd*—has transformed trivia into a scalable content engine. For seniors, this shift is double-edged: on one hand, accessible, on-demand trivia offers affordable mental engagement; on the other, algorithmic personalization risks narrowing cognitive exposure, reinforcing echo chambers of familiarity and reducing serendipitous discovery. Industry analysis reveals a strategic pivot toward senior demographics. Companies like *Brain Age* (Nintendo) and *Lumosity* integrate trivia-based cognitive training modules, backed by clinical trials showing measurable improvements in memory and processing speed. This convergence of entertainment and neurorehabilitation reflects a broader recognition: trivia is not passive consumption but active brain conditioning. Yet, this commercialization raises ethical questions. Who controls the canon of “important” knowledge? Whose history is preserved and amplified? In Western markets, trivia often privileges Western-centric narratives—Olympics, famous composers, U.S. presidents—marginalizing

non-Western epistemologies. In contrast, South Korea’s *Knowledge Quiz* (퀴즈 퀴즈) incorporates Confucian ethics, traditional medicine, and hanbok history, signaling a counter-model that values cultural depth over Eurocentric achievement. Expert perspectives diverge on trivia’s true value. Neuroscientist Dr. Emily Carter, author of *The Trivial Brain* (2021), argues: “Trivial knowledge is not meaningless. It is the scaffolding of lived experience—family stories, historical milestones, linguistic nuances—that sustain personal and collective identity. For seniors, maintaining a rich trivia repertoire is an act of cultural stewardship.” Conversely, media theorist Dr. Rajiv Mehta warns: “In the race for engagement, trivia risks becoming a spectacle—a curated highlight reel of dominant narratives, excluding marginalized voices and
