Comparative analysis across geographies reveals sharp contrasts. In Scandinavia, MCQs are part of a broader competency-based assessment that includes simulation training, peer review, and real-time feedback during clinical rotations. The result is a system where knowledge is continuously tested, adapted, and humanized. In contrast, in parts of Southeast Asia and sub-Saharan Africa, MCQs often dominate training with minimal integration into clinical practice, leading to a 'test-and-leave' cycle that fails to build sustained expertise. In India, a 2021 audit found that 45% of obstetric residents scored adequately on MCQs but performed poorly in real-life emergency scenarios—highlighting the gap between theoretical knowledge and applied skill. Long-term implications are profound. As digital health tools proliferate—AI-driven diagnostic assistants, mobile clinical decision support systems, and telemedicine platforms—the role of MCQs is evolving. They are increasingly used not just for certification but as dynamic learning modules that adapt to individual performance, offering personalized pathways to competence. Yet this technological shift demands rigorous validation to avoid entrenching algorithmic bias or reducing complex medicine to data points. Looking forward, the future of obstetrics MCQs must embrace hybrid models: integrating adaptive learning, scenario-based simulations, and culturally grounded case studies. The WHO's emerging framework on 'contextualized competence'

advocates for exams that reflect local epidemiology, language, and health system realities. In Rwanda, pilots using MCQs embedded in mobile apps with local clinical vignettes have shown a 28% improvement in diagnostic accuracy compared to traditional testing—proof that relevance drives effectiveness. Economically, investing in robust, context-sensitive obstetric assessment tools is not merely a health imperative but a development priority. The World Bank estimates that every \$1 invested in improving maternal health yields \$5 in economic returns through reduced disability, increased productivity, and stronger family stability. MCQs, when designed with precision and equity, can accelerate this return by scaling high-quality training efficiently. Geopolitically,
